### Rules Applicable to the Technical design of the Qualification Paper

### Language of paper

The Qualification Work is performed in relevant program's instruction language. In case of performance of the qualification paper in a foreign language, it is English, with 25-30-pages of Georgian auto-abstract attached to it.

### The structure of Qualification Paper consists of the following components:

- Header
- Review (when submitting the final paper)
- Table of contents
- List of tables, diagrams, illustrations, etc. presented in the work (if any)
- List of abbreviations used in the paper (optional)
- List of symbols used in the paper (optional)
- Main text of the paper
- Conclusion (recommendations, if any)
- References (list of quoted works)
- Annex (tables, illustrations, diagrams, questionnaire, etc.) if any

### Description of the structure of the Qualification Paper

Each component of the Qualification Paper structure shall start with a new page and its title (Ex: table of content, conclusion, etc.) shall be placed in the middle of the paper.

#### Header

The Header consists of the full title of the paper, the name and surname of the author, the name of the university and school, academic degree for which the paper has been submitted, the name and surname of the supervisor, the place and date of performing the paper.

#### Review

The title of the page represents Overview. The problem shall be briefly named in the review, the main goal of the research, the object of the research, results and findings shall be presented. The review shall not exceed 200 words. Past tense must be used during writing. The first line shall not be separated by a paragraph.

### Table of contents

The title of the page is the Table of Contents. The titles of the chapters and sub-chapters of the paper are listed in the left column of the table of contents; the starting page of the chapter or subchapter is indicated next to the name of each chapter or subchapter, in the right column; The table of contents is printed with single

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spacing.

The list of tables, diagrams, illustrations and etc. presented in the paper

The title of the page is a list of tables, diagrams, illustrations, etc. (Depends on what part of visual part is presented in the paper). The numbering of corresponding ones are listed in the left column (each of them is numbered independently from each other) and the starting page next to each of them is indicated in right column. The list of tables, diagrams, illustrations, etc. is printed with single spacing.

The list of abbreviations used in the paper

The title of the page is a list of abbreviations. The page shall contain a list of abbreviations and definitions used in the text of the paper.

The list of symbols used in the paper

The title of the page is a list of symbols. The page shall include a list of definitions of symbols used in the text of the paper.

The main text

The main text consists of the following parts: introduction and main part.

The introduction includes: demonstrates the topicality of the research issue, working hypothesis, goal of the performance of the paper, tasks, description of the used methods, theoretical and practical value of the paper.

The main part includes: review of the literature, methodology of the research, description and analysis of research results, substantiation and argumentation of the working hypothesis.

The division of the main part is carried out as follows:

### Chapter 1

- 1.1. Subchapter
- 1.2. Subchapter 2
- 2.1. Subchapter
- 2.2. Subchapter etc.

Chapters and sub-chapters presented in the main part must have titles. Each subsequent chapter shall start from a new page and the sub-chapter from the same page with two spaces apart.

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#### Conclusion

The title of the page is the Conclusion. It summarizes the results of study, determines their estimated value within the framework of the relevant science/discipline and presents the developed recommendations, if any.

#### References

The title of the page is Reference and includes a list of the literature quoted in the text of the paper. The literature indicated in the paper shall be placed in accordance with the alphabetical order of the first letter of the last name of the authors of these papers: accordingly: alphabetically Georgian-language literature is indicated first, then Russian-language literature, then Latin-language literature.

#### Annex

The title of the page is an Annex. The annex additionally includes illustrative material that is minor, but is used in the performance of the paper, ex: questionnaire, statistical data, tables, details of the analysis of the procedure, etc.

- Submitting and defending of the qualification paper/project
- Bachelor's program volume 14000-18000 words (exception is the School of Health Sciences 6000-8000 words, the School of Science and Technology 8000 words)
- Master's program volume 18,000-23,000 words (exception is the School of Health Sciences -12,000-14,000 words, the School of Science and Technology - 11,000 words, the School of Business and Administrative Sciences - 12,000 words)

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Assessment of each component is carried out in accordance with the following manner:

The student has fully mastered the necessary knowledge, reasoning is consistent and logical, conclusions are substantiated - 100%

The student has mastered a significant part of the necessary knowledge, reasoning is sufficiently consistent and logical, conclusions are substantiated - 75%

The student has partially mastered the necessary knowledge, reasoning is more or less consistent and logical, the conclusions need more substantiation - 50%

The student's information on the topic is scarce, reasoning is inconsistent and less logical, the conclusions are unsubstantiated - 25%

The student has not mastered the subject at all - 0%

Depending on the specifics of the educational program, a different criteria of assessment may be taken into consideration, but this should not contradict the essence of the evaluation criteria established by the present rule.
